A BRIEF HISTORY OF ASCENSION EV. LUTHERAN CHURCH ESCONDIDO, CALIFORNIA

By the grace of God, Ascension Ev. Lutheran Church will observe its twelfth year of service to the community of Escondido, California on April 21, 1980. From its humble beginning of conducting services in the Escondido Woman's Club, 240 S. Broadway, to its present day facilities which include a church edifice and an education/fellowship unit, Ascension Lutheran Church has grown from approximately twelve souls to over 160. Its purpose has been to serve the people of Escondido with the Gospel of Jesus Christ in all its truth and purity and to provide a Christian education for its children.

Ascension had its beginning in the Fall of 1967 when Mr. Harry E. Pasch and Mr. Kurt E. Rolland together with Rev. Lowel Smith of Reformation Lutheran Church in San Diego discussed the possibilites of starting a mission congregation in the Escondido area. The quickly growing 150 mile span between San Diego and Los Angeles was at this time almost void of WELS activity. The opportunity and potential for growth was astounding. Escondido, located 30 miles north of San Diego seemed a likely area to begin the continuation of WELS expansion into Southern California especially with the interest shown by residents in the area.

On April 11, 1968, a special meeting of the Executave

Board of Reformation Lutheran Church, San Diego, was held to discuss the matter of opening a branch congregation in Escondido. The Minutes of that meeting are recorded below:

Minutes of special meeting of the Executive B Board of Reformation Ev. Lutheran Church, San Diego. April 11, 1968. 8:45 pm.

Reformation Ev. Lutheran Church accepted to establish a branch congregation in Escondido, to be called Reformation Ev. Lutheran, Escondido Branch, with services to be held at the Escondido Woman's Club, 240 S. Broadway in Escondido with first services at 9:00 am. Sunday April 21, 1968.

Rev. Lowell Smith will be vacancy pastor. Synodical affiliation will be with Wisconsin Ev. Lutheran Synod.

Motion made and seconded that Kurt Rolland be appointed assistant Vice President and Harry Pasch be appointed assistant Treasurer of Reformation in care of offices in Escondido branch. Motion carried unanimously. Offices accepted by same respectively.

Reformation Evy Lutheran of San Diego offered loan of \$75.00 to Escondido branch to be used to pay current bills and repay the same from donations received.

\$75.00 to be deposited in checking account at Security First National Bank - Escondido Branch in name of Reformation Ev. Lutheran Church, San Diego, Escondido Branch.

Meeting adjourned at 9:15 pm.

April 21, 1968 marked the beginning of exploratory services in Escondido. In its early stages, Rev. Lowell Smith together with Rev. Edgar Hoenecke, Rev. Paul Heyn (then chairman of the California District Mission Board), and Vicar Carl Otto alternated in serving the congregation each Sunday. The first

seven weeks showed an average attendance of 25 per service.

The following was recorded in personal notes about the first few Sundays of Ascension's existence:

Sunday, April 21, 1968. First service of Reformation Ev. Lutheran Church, Escondido Branch held at 9 o'clock at Escondido Woman's Club. Total of 41 persons in attendance with donations of \$66.31. Pastor Paul Heyn of San Diego gave forst sermon with quests from Escondido, Vista, Oceanside, Fallbrook, and San Diego in attendance.

Sunday, April 28, 1968. Pastor Hoenecke preached the sermon today. Had 22 in attendance. Thought low attendance may be due to time change. Guests from San Diego and Escondido.

Sunday May 5, 1968. Third service, Pastor Smith spoke. Had guests John Brenninger and Mrs. Peterson. 15 in attendance.

Sunday May 19, 1968. 4th service, Vicar Carl Otto from Alpine spoke. 16 in attendance.

Sunday, May 26, 1968. Pastor Hoenecke spoke, 31 in attendance. Had church's first baptism - Heidie Kristine Caauwe.

Sunday, June 2, 1968. Pastor Hoenecke spoke again today. Held Communion service after regular service - 33 in attendance at service - 13 communed after regular service.

On August 1, 1968, Rev. Gilbert B. Seager, the California
District Missionary, became the first resident pastor of the congregation. On January 26, 1969, the mission congregation was formally organized as Ascension Ev. Lutheran Church, and two weeks later, on February 9, 1969, the church was incorporated.

discuss the possibilites of starting a mission congregation there. After a mumber of inquiry classes and meetings with the California District Mission Board chairman, it was recommended to the General Mission Board that a mission be started in this community. Thus, on March 30, 1969, Palm Sunday, 27 believers from Oceanside joined the WELS by reaffirming the true Lutheran faith at Ascension Lutheran Church in Escondido. Five others of the Oceanside group were already members of Ascension at this time.

On July 30, 1969, Candidate Lyke W. Lange was ordained and installed as the first pastor of Ascension. Pastor Seager moved to Oceanside at this time to serve our new congregation there.

At the Fortieth Biennial Convention of the Wisconsin Ev.

Lutheran Synod, conducted on August 6-13, 1969, Pastor I. G.

Frey, President of the Arizona-California District, recommended Pastor Lyle Lange and Ascension Ev. Lutheran Church for membership in the Wisconsin Synod. The church's constitution had been examined and approved by the District Committee on Constitutions and Legislation. From this point, the congregation began looking into possible sites for permanant location.

In October of 1969, 3.73 acres of land on North Midway Drive were purchased as the site of a future church, parsonage and day school. Pastor and Mrs. Lange had been living in a rented apartment up to this time. In July of 1970, ground was broken for the new 1600 sq. ft. parsonage, and on September 20, 1970,

it was dedicated.

Since the installation of Pastor Lange, the congregation had grown to over 40 communicants. The members of Ascension were aiming at an early self-support status. Funding for the chapel building had been delayed at this time. With the parsonage built and a church building to be built in the near future, an active canvass and evangelism program was undertaken in the neighborhood of the church site.

Ascension did not have to wait long for funding for its church building. In April of 1971, funding was granted from the Church Extension Fund for the erection of a church and fellowship unit on the property. Bids were received in August and on November 7, 1971, ground was broken for the construction of the new edifice. Duane Anderson, architectual consultant to the WELS, submitted the design which was one of five GBHM chapel schemes for mission congregations. Originally, the 3,300 sq. ft. building was to cost \$97,000. However, as is usually the case, hidden costs and unforseen problems arose which hiked the cost of construction. Mainly due to tight city regulations governing land developement, the ultimate cost of the structure wowld be \$120,000. The final cost would have been higher yet had not the congregation done a great deal of finish work and landscaping themselves. After a lot of hard work and eager anticipation, the day finally arrived when Ascension Lutheran Church was ready to hold its first services. On June 11, 1972, at the 10:15 am. service, the door was opened, the congregation entered, the liturgical

books and sacred vessels of the church were presented and the rite of dedication was begun. In the afternoon, a special 4:00 o'clock service of thanksgiving was conducted with Rev. Lowell Smith of Reformation Lutheran Church in San Diego as guest speaker for the occasion. The congregation of Escondido numbered 61 communicate members and 90 souls at this time.

The year 1973 marked another milestone in the history of The congregation reached self-support status, Ascension. receiving no operating subsidy from synod. About this same time, a growing concern was being expressed by the members of the congregation to seriously consider the start of a Christian day school in Escondido. Various members of the congregation had for some time been transporting their children to the Christian day school at Reformation in San Diego each day which meant a round trip distance of 50 or more miles. congregation had planned to start a day school in the Fall of 1975, but the energy crisis played a major role in starting the school a year earlier than planned. Approval was granted the congregation to open a school in the Fall of 1974 with one teacher for grades 1 - 8. During the first year, the fellowship area of the church was used as the classroom for the 21 students enrolled. The school is supported by the congregation with no tuition fee for its members.

The first teacher of the school was Miss Marcia Lindemann, a graduate of DMLC. She served the school until her resignation in 1979. The present teacher is Mr. Keith Bowe.

With the aid of a CEF loan, Ascension broke ground for a new school building on Sunday, July 20,1975. The 1456 sq. ft. unit was to serve as a classroom for grades 1 - 8, Sunday School rooms, and a fellowship hall. Mr. Gerald Vanselow, the consulting architect for the WELS, submitted the plans for the new structure. On Sunday, November 6,1975, in the 10:15 am. service the building was dedicated to the glory of God and the service of His children. Rev. Lowell Smith was the guest speaker at a special 4:00 o'clock afternoon service.

In August 1978, Pastor Lange received and accepted a call to DMLC as Professor of Religion. Pastor Samuel Kugler of Falbrook served the members of Ascension as vacancy pastor until the installation of Rev. Hugo Warnke on January 7, 1979.

Pastor Warnke is the second and present pastor of the congregation.

Ascension Lutheran Church has been active in recruiting its young people for full time work in the church. To date it has sent three men who are presently students at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, and one woman who is presently a student as DMLC. Since 1974 the congregation has helped its ministerial students each year with a \$100.00 scholarship from the Robert Lange Memorial Fund established in memory of the infant son of Pastor Lyle Lange who died that same year.

On the attached sheet is recorded the statistical reports to the Synod for Ascension Lutheran Church. The reports for the years 1968 - 1978 show the trends of the congregation in all aspects of its existence.
